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THAR 4720 – Global Theories of Performance (Forms of Drama)

Aiming to expand horizons beyond the West, this seminar examines key theoretical questions and debates from modern and contemporary Southern Africa, North Africa, the Middle East, Oceania, Latin America, East Asia, the Caribbean, and India. The course also incorporates readings in dramatic literature to present these theories in their respective historical, cultural, and theatrical contexts. Issues in postcolonialism, aesthetics, globalization, and interculturalism are also explored in this class in search of a genuinely global understanding of theatre and performance.

Research & Teaching Interests

Actor training and pedagogy, voice and movement training for performance, history of acting theory, practice as research, interdisciplinary research, dramatic theory & criticism, practical dramaturgy, Shakespeare, *Commedia dell'Arte*, mask design & construction, mask performance, aesthetics & philosophy of art, postcolonial theatre, feminist theatre, and applied theatre.

This practice-based seminar investigates contemporary understandings and assumptions of the actor's art through methods of Practice as Research. In applying an interdisciplinary approach, the perspectives explored belong to theorists from theater studies, literature, philosophy, and aesthetics. Students learn to raise new critical questions in acting, why it is important to do so, and how social, cultural, and aesthetic ideas shape acting practice. The course culminates with a final performance of scene and/or monologue work that demonstrates how critical inquiry informs students' personal approaches to dramatic acting.

THAR 4710 - History of Acting Theory (Seminar in Theatre History and Drama)

This seminar investigates the development of ideas concerning acting from Africa, Asia, the Americas, and Europe, spanning from antiquity to the present day. Students work towards developing a systematic understanding of the concepts and issues that informed ideas of what acting is, has been, or should be.

THAR 4700/5700 - Practicum in Dramaturgy

Practical experience as a dramaturg on School of Theater productions, including historical, textual, and biographical research, as well as audience outreach activities.
